




Figure 9. February 19, 2019 UF-CREC Juice Display Results (subjective meanscores from display attendees; scale of 0-10 with 10=perfect score). B9-65 is a superior clone of Valencia, 50/50 is a 1:1 blend of pasteurized Valquarius and LB8-9 Sugar Belle® juice; 90/10 a 9:1 blend of the same.




The HLB Tolerance of LB8-9; Sugar Belle®



- Sugar Belle harvest periods are compressed, 3-4 weeks
- How much fruit can move through a narrow window?
- Can Sugar Belle[®] contribute to the OJ stream?
- Can clever marketing move more fresh fruit?
- Marketing quality requires quality
- 2020 was a bad year for Sugar Belle® quality; will our changing climate mean more bad years?

- Very early and attractive, easy to peel and always seedless, superb eating experience; competitive with imported southern hemisphere fruit (late season W. Murcott/Tango)?
- Tree establishment and dieback challenges, but also vigorous growth and HLB tolerance
- Cropping challenges: fruit set/size, splitting, fruit drop
- Harvest challenges: clipping required
- Early conclusions based on young trees, are they valid?












Post-Harvest Performance



- Early and attractive, fairly easy to peel and always seedless, good quality; competitive with imported southern hemisphere fruit (late season W. Murcott/Tango)?
- Longer harvest season, can be held into December
- Good HLB tolerance
- Doesn't seem to bear fruit precociously on vigorous rootstocks
- Clipping likely is <u>not</u> required
- No long-term experience with growers until now, so risk is higher



Marathon Considerations

UF 914


- Red flesh color
- Attractive peel blush
- Grapefruit size (+)
- Grapefruit flavor and aroma
- Tender and juicy flesh
- Very low in FC's (GJE)
- Seedless
- Good brix, lower acid
- SWEETER!



- Potential medical claim to make, to recapture the "Senior Market"
- Is there a basis to market UF 914, other than the counter to the drug interaction? Yes! Focus group also showed that "grapefruit haters" really enjoyed UF 914 fruit
- Focus group showed it is distinguishable from grapefruit to ordinary consumers
- South Korea, what they buy, and how they use it
 - Red grapefruit, to mix with sugar and tea or "shojiu"
 - White fleshed "Sweeties" for fresh, but red is BETTER!

Seedless Lemons



- Many new sweet oranges with improved quality have been released; they are gaining traction, with growers and processors
- Several fresh cultivar options released under the Fast Track
- Rootstock releases from UF and USDA are having an impact; there is no simple answer for "what to plant?", but there is a lot of information that can provide guidance
- As with any financial investment, individuals should determine their own <u>risk tolerance</u> and balance this with <u>potential rewards</u>
- CREC breeding team is making a new hire to expand our trials, generate more insightful information, and to study how best to manage our new cultivars for success


