



Estimated Average Picking, Roadsiding and Hauling Charges for Florida Citrus, 2005-06 Season

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A survey was conducted in the Spring of 2006 to collect Florida citrus harvesting charges (picking, roadsiding and hauling). Harvesting charges for the 2005-06 season were collected for both fresh and processed market citrus fruit. The survey was not a statistically chosen sample; therefore, the charges may not represent Florida's total citrus industry. The participants were chosen because of their willingness to provide their harvesting charges. The survey will continue as long as there is adequate participation.

The harvesting charges provided by the participating firms came from either their own citrus harvesting division or from other commercial harvesting firms. All charges were reported in "Florida field box" units.^a The citrus varieties that harvesting were collected include early and late oranges, red and white grapefruit, temples/tangelos and tangerines.

The harvesting charges were summarized into three categories as follows:

- -- **Picking** represents the cost paid to the person picking or removing the fruit from the tree.
- -- Roadsiding represents the costs which the harvester incurs to transport the "picked" fruit to the transport flatbed truck or trailer. Also, included in these charges are the costs for fruit pallets boxes or tubs; ladders and worker transport equipment; payroll taxes insurance (workers compensation, liability, etc.).
- -- **Hauling** represents the costs associated with transporting the fruit to either the fresh fruit packinghouse or juice processing plant.

The 2005-06 average picking, roadsiding and hauling charges for Florida citrus are presented in the attached table. The charges shown are for both fresh and processed market citrus and are presented as a range and overall average. picking and roadsiding charges for fresh fruit were higher than processed fruit. Compared with 2004-05 charges, 2005-06 average picking charges were 10% to 21% higher for oranges and 5% to 10% higher for grapefruit. Picking charges for Valencia oranges after May 15th were 19% higher than the season average. No distinction was reported for hauling charges between citrus varieties. Depending on hauling distance, 2005-06 hauling charges for fresh fruit were 10% to 32% higher than 2004-05; processed hauling charges were 9% to 15% higher.

A comparison of picking, roadsiding and hauling charges from 2003-04, 2004-05 and 2005-06 seasons are shown on Table 2.
