



Average Packing Charges for Florida Fresh Citrus – 2005-06 Season

Florida fresh citrus packers were contacted to collect data on the average "packing charges" for the 2005-06 season. A total of seventeen packinghouses from both the Indian River and Interior production regions provided data for the survey. This is not a statistically chosen sample; therefore, the charges may not be representative of Florida's total citrus packinghouse industry. The participants were chosen because of their willingness to participate in the survey. The information reported were "packing charges," not actual packing costs.

The average packing charges are presented in 4/5 bushel carton equivalents. The total average packing charges include the following items:

- 1. Materials including mesh/plastic bags, labels/Price Lookup Codes (PLUs), etc.
- 2. Supervisor/foreman labor, grading, palletizing, shipping and general labor including payroll taxes, workers' compensation, ground insurance, etc.
- 3. Other direct packing costs include items such as: fruit treating; power, lights and water; repairs and maintenance; miscellaneous supplies; etc.
- 4. Indirect packing costs include such items as: insurance-fire and casualty; taxes and licenses; depreciation and rent.
- 5. General and Administrative (G&A) costs include: office personnel (payroll taxes, w/comp); packinghouse and general manager; office supplies; telephone; etc.
- 6. Selling Expenses which include sales salaries, travel telephone and telegraph and brokerage fees.

7. Special assessments include such items as: advertising taxes; inspection fees; Florida Citrus Packers; Citrus Administrative Committee (CAC).

Total packing charges per 4/5 carton equivalent were collected for five variety categories: domestic grapefruit; export grapefruit; oranges; temples and tangelos; and tangerines. Along with the total packing charges, information was collected on Florida field box bases for fruit drenching charges, packinghouse eliminations charges and hauling charges for fruit elimination to the juice processors.

A summary of the estimated average packing charges is presented in Table 1. The 2005-06 average packing charges for the five variety categories were: domestic grapefruit (\$4.016/carton); export grapefruit (\$4.395/carton); oranges (\$4.347/carton); temples and tangelos (\$4.614/carton); and tangerines (\$5.469/carton). Fruit drenching charges ranged from \$0.181/box to \$0.189/box depending on the citrus variety category. Average packinghouse eliminations charges ranged from \$0.545/box to \$0.553/box for all varieties. Hauling charges for eliminations averaged from \$0.505/box to \$0.534/box.

A comparison of packing charges from 2003-04, 2004-05 and 2005-06 seasons are shown on Table 2.
