



Estimated Average Picking, Roadsiding and Hauling Charges for Florida Citrus, 2011-12 Season

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Florida citrus harvesters were contacted during the Spring-Summer of 2012 to collect Florida citrus harvesting charges (picking, roadsiding and hauling). Harvesting charges for the 2011-12 season were collected for both fresh and processed market citrus fruit. This was not a statistically chosen sample; therefore, the charges may not represent Florida's total citrus picking, roadsiding and hauling industry. The participants were chosen because of their willingness to provide their harvesting charges. The information reported was "harvesting charges," not actual harvesting costs.

The harvesting charges provided by the participating firms came from either their own citrus harvesting division or from other commercial harvesting firms. All charges were reported in "Florida field box^a" units. The citrus varieties for which harvesting charges were collected include early and late oranges, red and white grapefruit, temples/tangelos and tangerines.

The harvesting charges were summarized into three categories as follows:

- Picking represents the cost paid to the person picking or removing the fruit from the tree.
- Roadsiding represents the costs which the harvester incurs to transport the "picked" fruit to the transport flatbed truck or trailer. Also, included in these charges are the costs for fruit pallets boxes or tubs; ladders and worker transport equipment; payroll taxes insurance (workers compensation, liability, etc.).
- **Hauling** represents the costs associated with transporting the fruit to either the fresh fruit packinghouse or juice processing plant.

The 2011-12 average picking, roadsiding and hauling charges for Florida citrus are presented in Table 1. The charges shown are for both fresh and

processed market citrus and are presented as a range and overall average. There was a minimal change in the 2011-12 picking charges for early variety oranges compared to the 2010-11 season. The season average for Valencia oranges increased over 14% with most of the increase occurring toward the end of the season. From May through June, Valencia picking charges increased 12% compared to the 2010-11 season. The increase was due to harvesting labor moving to other crops such as melon and blueberries in Florida and the southeastern United States. Roadsiding charges for oranges remained about the same as the 2010-11 season.

Average picking and roadsiding charges for the other variety groups (grapefruit, temples/tangelos and tangerines) showed little change over 2010-11 charges. No distinction was reported for hauling charges between citrus varieties. However, with fuel prices somewhat lower during much of the 2011-12 season, the average hauling charges were slightly lower than in 2010-11.

A comparison of picking, roadsiding and hauling charges from 2007-08, 2008-09, 2009-10, 2010-11 and 2011-12 seasons are shown in Table 2.
